Briefs from SMRC Board

Organizations who have a need to borrow capital funds from time to time are required to have annual financial audits. Recently an audit was completed and a report given to the SMRC Board. This becomes a standard accounting procedural report. Considering the times, our auditor reported that our organization is financially stable. We continue to maintain efficiencies in the operations, while gearing up to increase occupancy on campus in order to remain healthy into the future.

SMRC is a member of the not-for-profit advocacy association called Leading Age Kansas. Rachel Monger, L.A.K. CEO, attended our June board meeting to bring a state-wide report. She reported that \$167M additional funding towards senior services was awarded for fiscal year 2024. L.A.K. advocacy paid off well this year in order to get Medicaid funding more in line with actual costs. In addition to working government affairs, L.A.K. provides education solutions, seeks out partnerships, monitors regulatory and legal issues, as well as, offers scholarships for leadership training. Monger comments "The stronger the long term care providers are, the stronger we are as an association".

The SMRC board was given a briefing on a new hospice service starting up in July. Progressive Healthcare Alliance (PHA) is a collaboration of 15 long term care homes in this part of Ks. PHA recently purchased a small hospice company and now plans to expand those services in the Alliance region. We are excited about this new service called Community Care Hospice that will provide our in-house hospice services to the residents if or when needed.

The SMRC board is made up of 9 members representing our sponsoring churches plus a few at-large from the community. Bill Anderson, Sterling, has joined the board as our newest member. The Board is very supportive of the mission as they desire to have one of the best elder care options in the state of Kansas.




